

Who Are We?

Who Are We? Demographics

- 75 individuals participated in the survey
 - ~60% female, 40% male
- Family oriented
 - 67% of parishioners are married or in committed relationships
- Average age is ~58 yrs old
- Average years of attendance is 6
- Vast majority are full time residents in the Jacksonville area





Who Are We? Participation

Worship

- 70-75% of parishioners attend weekly
- 20% attend more than once a month
- 30% claim to have increased attendance since 2008
 - Compared to 8% indicating a decrease

Ministries

- 29% of have increased participation since 2008
 - Compared to 18% indicating a decrease
- Only 1/3 of St. Patrick's children attend Christian Formation or are active in our ministries

Who Are We? General Preferences


- Just over 50% of parishioners prefer worship service to start after 8 am
 - ~1/3 of respondents have no preference
- Just under 50% of parishioners prefer service to be over before noon
 - ~1/3 of respondents have no preference

Who Are We? Worship Preferences

- Survey Questions:
 - I prefer a more traditional service
 - I prefer a more contemporary/emerging service, including different art forms and Audio/Visual media
 - I prefer a blended service
 - I prefer a mix of worship service
- The people of St Patrick's prefer a mix of <u>blended</u> services that have both traditional and new elements
 - Although preferences were mixed to the first three questions
 - 47% prefer blended, 41% prefer traditional, 30% prefer contemporary, 41% responded "sometimes"
 - 48% expressed a desire for a mix of worship styles
 - When combined with the "sometimes" response, 84% of the people prefer a mix of worship services


Miscellaneous

- ~62% of the respondents pledge
 - Compared with 54% of all St. Patrick's parishioners
- 20% of the respondents give without pledging
 - Quite a few respondents (17%) give in other ways
- St. Patrick's is a fairly tech savvy church
 - Much of the church uses email or the website
 - Phone contact was the second highest preferred means of communication
- Twitter and Facebook have a low usage among respondents




What Are St. Patrick's Greatest Assets or Strengths?




These are the Top 10 identified strengths


Rector Characteristics




Rector Roles - What Should the New Rector Be Good at Doing?




What Should Our New Rector Be Good at Doing? Worship and Liturgy



What Should our New Rector be Good at Doing? Pastoral Care









In what areas do you feel St. Patrick's needs to grow?




